'On the afternoon of Saturday 28th January, Staffordshire took on Sussex in the quarterfinals of the cup. THS were well represented with four players in the squad, though Kyle Johnson would have been a fifth if injury hadn't kept him out. Staffs struggled against a talented and physical Sussex side, quickly going two goals down. However Staffs, with captain Jack Bromfield leading by example, soon got back into the game and were unlucky to go into half time 2-1 down.

The second half saw Joe Trevor brought on in goal and his commanding and courageous performance gave the team more confidence. Alex Minshull played a typically unflappable game at centre back, and substitute Tom Bromfield added further stability to the defence. Staffs scored a well-deserved equaliser with ten

minutes to go, and from this point there was only one team in it; they duly won the game with only a few minutes to spare.

Staffordshire are now through to the final four of a competition that started with 37 teams, thanks in no small part to the contribution of the Trentham Year 11s. Their hard work and resilience made them a credit to the school.
