The game kicked off and the tempo was quickly set by Ryan Bromley and Josh Ryder, who let the opposing team feel their presence with numerous heavy yet clean tackles. As more pressure was added by great defensive

conversions and pace from fullbacks Brodie Mack and Lewis Fullwood the opposing team began to rapidly become more defensive minded, Although after various attacks Westwood began to counter as their pacey striker went one and one with the keeper to which Joe Trevor managed to save and regain possession. Around twenty minutes into the game after plenty of chances brought around from players such as Mitch Glover and Josh Ryder and excellent and aggressive pressure from Kyle Johnson a throw in was won on the left-hand side of the pitch. Lewis Fullwood dynamically threw the ball across the goal area, which was then flicked on dangerously by Ryan Bromley and then followed up by Kyle Johnson who sneakily put the ball into the net to put Trentham 1-0 up. A few minutes later Josh Roberts came off the pitch due to feeling unwell and was replaced by Alex Minshull. Moments before half time after great build up play another cross found itself landing right in front of the striker who comfortably poked it in for the second goal of the game. Unfortunately due to 'career threatening' cramp Kyle Johnson requested to be substituted and Joe wood came onto the pitch. This left Trentham 2-0 up as the half time whistle was blown.

Following a brilliant first half of football Trentham got off to a shaky start, but defensively the team maintained a tight and determined attitude throughout the game. They quickly retained their previous form and seemed desperate to score, multiple crosses from Lewis Fullwood, runs from Harry Baggaley, flicks from Ryan Bromley and lovely pinged balls from Josh Ryder and even numerous headers from Mitch Glover created opportunities for Trentham but none were taken. Both Alex Minshull and Jack Hawkins battled with a large forward and were coping confidentially, and kept the opposing striker from really looking dangerous. Twenty minutes into the second half Mitch Glover was taken off the field for Mike Stoddard and Harry Baggaley was swapped for Kyle Johnson. Disappointingly after a scrappy corner and multiple attempts at clearing the ball a Westwood striker found the bottom left hand corner of the goal leaving the keeper with no chance of stopping it from crossing the line making the score 2-1.

Although having just conceded a goal Trentham kicked off and piled on more pressure than ever, runs from both wingers and overlapping full-backs, forced the opposing team to crumble. Only minutes after conceding, the ball was passed back to Lewis Fullwood who beautifully curved the ball directly onto the head of Josh Ryder who had no other option but to score, this gave Trentham back the two goal lead they deserved. Despite gaining back a goal the away team didn't ease off and just five minutes after their previous goal and an embarrassing nutmeg by

Brodie Mack, Josh Ryder took a venomous strike that glided past the Westwood keeper. Then just a minute or two after that Josh Ryder hunted for the ball and found it as it bounced on the edge of the box and smacked it with his weak foot to score a hatrick in no more than 7 minutes and making the score 5-1 to Trentham. The opposing team were left in a shambles and only just managed to hold on without conceding for the remainder of the game, but even they knew they had been completely torn apart. The final whistle blew leaving the score at 5-1 and allowed Trentham to move on to the semi-finals.

Each player put on a brilliant show that could not be faulted, leaving all the players and the manager Mr Ablewhite feel delighted with the performance and bringing the team confidence as they move forward in the competition.'

It was really good to see first-hand how prepared Lily was to get involved with organising and running the javelin section during the first half of the event, conversing with the athletes, recording distances thrown and working alongside other volunteers and staff.
